A big thanks go to the donors of the auction and raffle prizes and to the many businesses in Cherrybrook who donated cakes and other items. The donation of two nights at

Thanks also to the members and friends of Kiwanis who spent many hours cooking the beautiful cakes sold on the day. Members also donated raffle prizes and canvassed businesses for donations.

The cause of 'all the funds go to Sydney Children's Hospital Randwick and in particular our Comfort Care Cases' was an easy message on the day. We even attracted two people to want to know more about Kiwanis and how they can help. One of those has already attended a meeting and decided to join our team.







The other follow-up we have had is a member of the Blue Mountains Hospital in Katoomba want to know how to introduce a Comfort Care Case to their hospital. We have put then in touch with Kirsty at SCHR and look forward to the expansion of the CCC program.

The Comfort Care Cases is the **signature project** of Kiwanis Sydney. We have been the sole sponsor for 11 years since 2013-14.

A signature project should have:-

- Significant impact helps the terminally ill kids and their families
- Community need helps sick kids, their families and the nursing staff
- Enhances the Kiwanis brand signage at our stall,
 Kiwanis shirts and chance to tell others about our work
- Creates partnerships partnerships with donors of prizes, cakes and auction items and with KADCF for donations
- Recurring we have supported CCC for 11 years
- Strengthens membership we have gained new members from this project.



Lidcombe Vege Pods



Our relationship with Lidcombe Public School continues. Lidcombe Public School have 3 special education classes of students with complex sensory, learning and behavioural needs. After discussions with the Deputy Principal, Kiwanis Sydney decided to purchase two raised garden beds on wheels called Vege Pods. These will allow the kids to grow some vegetables and learn how to prepare them for eating. Some of the herbs will also serve as sensory stimulants.

After contacting Sarah at Bunnings Lidcombe they kindly agreed to donate the 12 bags of potting mix to the project. Thanks to Belinda for

picking these up and delivering them.

Kiwanis Sydney has purchased the two Vege Pods for delivery to the school and assembly by the school handyman. We look forward to seeing this project "flourish".


#Kids need Kiwanis!
